# What We Did This Week:

## Literacy:

short stories. We will compare/contrast

### Math Workshop:

We have been working on place value, comparing numbers, and number patterns. The concepts covered in this unit include how to count, read, and write numbers to 10,000. We have been using base-ten blocks to develop the association between the physical representation of the number, the number itself, and the number word.
